

Mae yna ddigon o hanesion difyr amdani ond prin fu'r wybodaeth am ei bywyd cynnar, felly dyma grynodedeb o deyrnged ei nith iddi ar ddydd yr angladd – “ Ganed Doreen Gloria Ifans (Morgan) ar y 24ain o Orffennaf 1928 yn Llangynnwr. Hi oedd yr ifancaf o bum plentyn, tri ohonynt yn hanner perthyn. John Morgan oedd ei that yn briod a Gwenllian gyda thri phlentyn iddynt, David, Daniel a Peggy. Felly mae lle i gredu i'r Clifford Arms ar waelod Rhiw Graig fod unwaith yn perthyn i'r Ystâd estron honno. Daw enghreifftia eraill i'n sylw fel Dinefwr Arms ac Emlyn Arms.

Efallai i rai ohonoch fwynhau pryd o fwyd yn Tŷ Bwyta'r Forge ar y ffordd i Sanclêr rywbyrd. Fel awgryma'r enw Gweithdy'r Gof fu yma'n wreiddiol, a phrofodd y te a'r brechdanau'n boblogaidd wrth i'r cwsmeriaid aros eich tro ger y gweithdy. Mor boblogaidd nes i rai droi lan jyst am y bwyd. 

Note: You do not need a code to access the defibrillator

If anyone has a cardiac arrest the sooner CPR is given and defib used, the more likely the patient will survive. Every minute is important, and the ambulance service will help you do this on the phone until the first responder arrives. This may be the local fire service who have been trained to do this. They will stay until the ambulance arrives.

If you are not sure about using a defibrillator, you can borrow a training pack from me to show you and the family how to give CPR and how to use the defibrillator. Although none of the village defibrillators have been used, you never know when you might need to help, so just going through the process with a training pack may help you and your family save a life. Brechfa Forest West Wind Farm Community Fund

I'm Moisha Merry and I'm the Fund Manager for the Brechfa Forest West Wind Farm Community Fund. I work for Antur Cymru who are the Fund Administrators. We are excited to have just launched our new website for the fund www.brechfawestcommunityfund.org.uk. Here you can find a full list of awards made so far; detailed case studies, information on how to apply to the fund or how you can nominate yourself to be considered as a new member of our grants panel; a list of frequently asked questions and much more. In the first 2 years of operation the fund has committed in excess of £1.4 million to 91 projects, that significantly benefit the communities living within 6km of the wind farm.

It's fair to say that the fund is very heavily oversubscribed at present, but please don't let that put you off discussing your potential application to the fund with me. I can be contacted by phone 07779 457351 or email: mmerry@anturcymru.org.uk. I am unable to present to groups as there are so many in the funds area of benefit, but I run regular funding surgeries to discuss applications where we can go through your project idea in detail.

I often get asked about how to write the most professional application, but this isn't what our panel members are looking for. The panel just want to know the benefit to local people and the impact of the funded work. They're also looking for value for money and where possible, are keen local businesses are considered to undertake any funded work to maximise the local benefit of the fund. The panel are also keen for applicants to consider the longer-term impact of their proposed project as the fund will be here for the lifetime of the wind farm (up to 25 years) and is keen to really maximise its long term positive impact on our rural communities. Anyone wishing to be considered as a potential panel member can contact me for an application form. We currently have a vacancy for a representative from the Llanpumsaint/Peniel/Rhydargaeau area.

The wind farm is owned and operated by RWE renewables, but decisions on all awards are made by the grants panel members. The fund aims to support projects that significantly benefit the communities living within 6km of the wind farm. Occasionally we have funded projects based outside of the area of benefit, but only in exceptional circumstances to places such as Calon Tysul or Nantgaredig Rugby Club where we have funded on a proportional basis for the young people in our funds area.

Projects for the Llanpumsaint area funded so far have included: Llanpumsaint School PTA; Llanpumsaint Allotments; Merched Y Wawr; a feasibility study to consider if a community shop is needed; replacement defibrillator cabinet for Llanpumsaint, Skanda Vale and Dolgran; an award towards the costs of the Llanpumsaint website and Village Voice for 5 years and Cylch Meithrin Bronwydd,

We've also funded larger projects that benefit people in the Llanpumsaint area including: the Pencader Family Centre Coordinator's salary; Llanllawddog Hall's recent renovations which included provision of water and an electrical upgrade. We've also made our largest award to date in this area as we've committed £260,000 over 5 years to Skanda Vale Hospice towards the purchase of Skanda Hafan, their new bunkhouse in Dolgran. The income generated from the bunkhouse, once open after Covid restrictions lift, will enable the hospice to be much less grant dependant and will reliably generate enough income to increase their fantastic free residential hospice provision from 7 days a month to 365 days a year over time.

We have also funded a fully accessible community electric car and charge points in the area! If you would like to use the car, or arrange a voluntary driver, please contact Dolen Teifi on 01559 362403. Another award has brought back rural banking to the area by funding Save Easy Credit Union who have set up local service points. You can contact them on [01554 770867](tel:01554770867) to find out more.

We've also funded Llyfrau Llafar who have added local books such as Arwyn Thomas's book, a History of Llanpumsaint to their audio library which can be accessed free by contacting 01267 238225. Likewise if you want information on how to access resources for those supporting or living with Autism in lockdown; support for our many local Young Carers; accredited training with Tir Coed, or support with Tourism as part of the Cambrian Mountain Initiative who are designating local spots for dark skies tourism; please contact me and I can put you in touch with any of these funded projects the Brechfa Wind Farm Community Fund has been proud to support. DOT's Youth Group

Carmarthen Council Garden Waste Collection Service

As we now have to make an appointment to visit the refuse tip, it may be useful to know that the service listed above is available between the months of March and November. The service costs £52.43 for the season. However, if you pay in full by credit or debit card you will receive a 15% discount, total cost of only £45. For new customers, when you apply, the council will deliver a green wheelie bin to your home which your waste will be collected from fortnightly. Your waste will then be recycled and turned into compost. They will also advise you of what materials are acceptable. It is advised that you put the bin outside the evening prior to collection.

This is a scam so DO NOT give them any money - just tell them where to go!

The official way to get an appointment is from the NHS website:-

"The NHS will contact you when it's your turn to have the coronavirus (COVID-19) vaccination. The vaccine is being offered at larger vaccination centres, pharmacies and some local NHS services such as hospitals or GP surgeries. When it's your turn, you'll be contacted by letter, text or email with information on how to book your appointment." Some GP practices may also phone you as they should have your contact number and of course they will not ask you for any money!

Doreen Evans

Many readers will remember Doreen Evans who lived at Rose Cottage for some years, she was quite a local character! Doreen died aged 92 on New Year's Day. Locals can share many stories of Doreen's time in Llanpumsaint but when Rev'd Gaynor was preparing for her funeral it seemed no one knew much about Doreen's early life. Below is an extract of the eulogy read by Doreen's great niece at her funeral. "Doreen Gloria Evans nee Morgan was born on the 24th July 1928 in Llangunnor. Doreen was the youngest of five siblings, three of which were half-siblings. Her father, John Morgan, was married to Gwenllan and they had three children, David, Daniel and Peggy. Sadly, Gwenllan passed away during the birth of Peggy. John Morgan later went on to remarry Hannah, with whom he had two further children Ray and Doreen.

Despite these sad circumstances, Doreen grew up in a warm and happy household where she had a lovely relationship with all her siblings. As a child she grew up with her siblings in the Roundhouse in Llangunnor. Although Doreen was just a child when the second world war had broken out, like many her life was not untouched by the savages of war. Both her older half-brothers Daniel (Danny) and David served in the War. David was a Desert Rat under the command of Field Marshall Montgomery in North Africa, whilst Danny served in the Navy. Sadly, only one of her brothers returned home from the conflict. Her brother Danny perished when the navy oil tanker he was travelling, the SS Empire Amethyst, was sunk by a German U-Boat south of Haiti in April 1942. Doreen had kept a silk handkerchief from the Panama Canal that her brother had sent home shortly before he was killed.

Doreen left school at the age of 16 and began working as cleaner at a local Dentist. In adulthood, she met and then married her husband Ieuan Evans on 20th December 1952. They settled into married life and moved to Llwynteg in Pontantwyn. Although they did have any children of their own, Doreen always adored children. She was kind and always had time for her niece and nephew. Sadly, her husband Ieuan passed away suddenly in 1972 at the age of 55 and she did not go on to remarry. She continued to live in her marital home until she moved to Rose Cottage, Llanpumsaint to live with her sister Ray and brother-in-law when Ray became unwell.

Doreen lived independently at Rose Cottage for a number of years, but after the passing of her sister Ray and then her brother in law Cliff, alongside her own health concerns, she moved to Cartref Ael Y Bryn Care Home in Ammanford. Doreen was greatly loved and will be sadly missed."

The long dark wet days have been a struggle of many of us, especially in addition to what is already a challenging time. As with every year, this is the time I look at the daylight hours increasing by five minutes a day and feel a sense of hope! There are signs of new growth in the hedgerows and the bulbs are starting to make headway (despite being covered in snow while I write this), and I for one am being to think about what we'll be growing in the allotment this year. Benjamin Cross new resident news!

I moved to Nebo with my family in late 2018. We'd been living in a two-up-two-down semi-detached house in a town in Oxfordshire for the ten years prior, so moving out here to a small-holding in rural Carmarthenshire has been a steep learning curve! That said, we simply haven't looked back. Putting to one side the beauty, tranquillity and history of the area, the community here has been nothing but friendly and welcoming. We've made some wonderful new friends, my boys have settled into the local school, and we feel right at home. So much so in fact that there's been another recent addition to the clan: a little puppy called Ludo.

I'm an archaeologist by profession, but I also write fiction and my debut novel COLONY is about to hit the shelves. It's a dream come true. I first started writing it a decade ago, since when I've written a second thriller and started on a third, all inspired by my career in archaeology.

The story follows Callum Ross, professor of archaeology at the University of Aberdeen. Callum finds himself undertaking a survey on a remote Arctic island, only recently discovered. It's not long before he discovers an ancient ice mummy, a prehistoric corpse preserved by the freezing temperatures. It's the discovery of a lifetime, but it's also a disturbing find. Why? Because whoever it is has suffered a horrific and mysterious death...

Callum is eager to solve the mystery, but there are others who have different ideas, and he and the rest of the team end up stranded on the island. And they are not alone. There is something else living in this ancient place, trapped amongst the ice floes, a thousand miles from anything resembling civilisation.

It is a fast-paced thriller, laced with action, adventure and suspense, and seasoned with a pinch of horror. And beyond the escapism, the twists, thrills and spills, there are several over-arching themes running through the novel too, the main one being *climate change*. The remote island on which the team become stranded is in fact only accessible due to the recent, dramatic reduction in sea ice. While I wouldn't claim the novel as an allegory, it is fair to say that everything that happens (i.e. goes wrong!) stems from this new and 'unnatural' accessibility, alongside the reckless determination of certain individuals to exploit it.

COLONY is published in paperback and as an ebook on 28th January 2021. It is available to pre-order now from all good bookstores – including Waterstones, WHSmiths and Goldstone Books in Carmarthen – and you can find additional info, links, reviews, interviews and other details on the official website: <https://www.benjamin-cross.com/>

KEEP WALES SAFE from the Welsh Government

The ever-changing COVID-19 situation continues to put NHS staff and services under huge pressure. Now more than ever people need to think carefully about where the right place is to seek advice and avoid extra pressure on the NHS this winter. However, the NHS is still here for you if and when you need it, but the way you access services might be different.

We are encouraging people to still attend their hospital appointments when asked to or review their treatment. A range of appropriate measures have been taken in hospitals to keep people safe, including treating people with coronavirus or suspected coronavirus in separate areas to those who do not have the virus to prevent the risk of it spreading.

The NHS is working hard to keep services running while trying to keep you safe. If you are worried about persistent symptoms contact your GP. After being offered a medical appointment please make sure you attend at the scheduled time. It is safe to do so. Alternatively, you may be offered a video consultation; this is still a full consultation visit but saves you travelling to your local surgery.

As well as making sure you seek help when you need it, the Keep Wales Safe campaign is asking people to use the online symptom checker on the NHS 111 Wales website (111.wales.nhs.uk) or call 111 for advice on where to go to get the right treatment.

By choosing the right service for your needs we can ensure we do not put extra pressure on GPs, Emergency Departments and the emergency ambulance services as they continue to tackle the pandemic. Did you know that community pharmacies play a key role in helping people, with minor ailments and injuries, get the right medicines and support. Where possible you can assist pharmacists by ordering repeat prescriptions seven days before they are due. Or if you have a minor injury there are clinics that can treat you so you don't need to go to A&E? Find your closest clinic online.

And remember if you have COVID symptoms no matter how mild, please self-isolate and book a test by calling 119 or call 111 if symptoms persist and you can no longer cope at home.

Census approaches The Office for National Statistics (ONS) has appointed a Census Engagement Manager to support Carmarthenshire and Pembrokeshire residents and help make Census 2021 a success. Nia Taylor, the area's Census Engagement Manager, will help organisations, charities, faith groups and community leaders within the County to raise awareness of the census and the value to residents in taking part. The census is a once-in-a-decade survey that provides a snapshot of households in England and Wales, helping to plan and fund public services.

Everyone across England and Wales will be asked to take part and the information people give will decide how services are planned and funded. Ultimately, it ensures funds are invested in emergency services, health care, school places and other vital services.

Pete Benton, Director of Census and Survey Operations, said: "The census engagement managers and community advisers we have appointed have a critical role in making sure everyone understands why the census is important and making sure all households across England and Wales know why it is important to take part and how to get the help they need."

For the first time, the census will be run primarily online, making it easy for most people to complete the questionnaire on any device – whether that be a computer, a mobile phone or a tablet. Local Census support centres will be offering help, while paper questionnaires will be available for those who need them. All census staff will operate in line with the Government's latest Covid-19 guidance.

The 2021 Census will include a new question on veterans of the UK Armed Forces, as well as voluntary questions, for those aged 16 and over, on sexual orientation and gender identity.

The census will be held on 21 March 2021. While results will be available the following year, all personal records will be locked away for 100 years and kept safe for future generations.

Public Houses

Now that those pubs that remain are temporarily closed it seems opportune to remind ourselves of the past. There were a lot more of them then and their names divulge much about them. For hundreds of years people drank beer in preference to water, safer, healthier, free of infection and available from breakfast on. Meetings of the Parochial Church Council in Llanpusaint were allocated and enjoyed a regular generous beer allowance, which no doubt aided discussion, well up to a point anyway. It became a long established custom for craftsmen to give customers a drink as they waited for a tool to be finished or repaired. At The Coopers Llanpumsaint they'd enjoy a pint whilst the cart wheel was being changed. It was fairly obvious why you'd have called at the The Carpenters Arms in Bronwydd. The Hollybrook however witnessed a name change. Up until the 1850's (when it closed) it was the Clothiers Arms, and no doubt the material came from Felinfach, just up the road where the mill operated. Shut for over a century it re-opened as The Hollybrook public house in 1980 after the Bronwydd Arms ceased. The Rock and Fountain, situated once next to a series of quarries in the Conwil valley, slated the thirst of those parched stone workers.

Back at Llanpumsaint, The Railway Inn right next to the Station was aptly christened, but the GWR would not allow their Station master who built it to run a pub, so he rented it and set up a Post Office next door. Down in the old village the large house next to the Church changed its name a few times. Now Ger y Llan, it was London House before, when it was a shop. Going further back it was Y Ty Mawr and a pub, once run by a man who ran a School in the back of the Church, before 1864 when the present school was built. It is revealing to learn that when two groups of Methodists fell out in the 18th century, one lot led by Howell Harries began to worship in the pub before the chapel was built. They saw nothing wrong with it then!

Many pubs adopted the name of the landed estate on whose land they were built. A Cwmgwili Arms was once located just beyond Pentre Morgan on the Conwil road, and the late Bronwydd Arms lay on land belonging to the Bronwydd Estate near Henllan Newcastle Emlyn. Clifford Arms, once at the bottom of Rhiw Graig suggests it once part of that distant estate. There are so many dotted around our countryside, Dinefwr Arms and Emlyn Arms for example.

Some of you may have dined at the Forge Restuarant at some point just this side of Saint Clears, and once just a blacksmith shop. Then as customers waited cups of tea and tasty sandwiches were brought out, so tasty that some began to turn up just for the food. Succulent steaks nowadays but that anvil has long gone. The popular Red Lion, Black Lion and White Lion are heraldic reflecting the coats of Arms of Landed Estates and royalty, and the Blue Bell in Conwil reflects it was near the Church, fairly obvious.
