Bu yn Gynghorydd y Gymuned ers 1972 ac yn aelod o bwylgorau'r Neuadd, Lles ac Adloniant, yn Gadeirydd ar Glwb y Bowls Mat Byr, ac yn Llywodraethwr o'n ysgol gynradd ac Ysgol Uwchradd Cambria. Daeth nifer teilwng i Amlosgfa Arberth, i dalu'r gymwynas olaf, ac yn garedig iawn, wnaeth Teulu Pandy drefnu lluniaeth ysgafn i'r galarwyr yn y Roadhouse Restaurant gerllaw Hendy Gwyn ar ôl y cynhebrwng. Mae Coed Cadw (Woodland Trust) wedi cyhoeddi cynllun i greu Coedwig Ganmlwyddiant y Rhyfel Byd Rhyfel Cyntaf yng Nghymru. Mae'r tir a nodwyd yn safle 120 erw ger pentref Carwe yn nhirwedd donnog Cwm Gwendraeth i'r Gogledd Orllewin o Lanelli, ger Cae Rasio Ffos Las.

Bwriad y mudiad yw creu coedwig newydd ymhob un o bedair gwlad y DU, i goffáu Canmlwyddiant y Rhyfel Byd Cyntaf. Yn anaml iawn y bydd tir yn dod ar y farchnad ar y raddfa hon ac mae Coed Cadw angen codi o leiaf hanner miliwn o bunnau erbyn diwedd mis Awst i fod yn hyderus y bydd y prosiect yn hyfyw yn ariannol ac y gall y mudiad ymrwymo i brynu, plannu a gofalu am y safle, gan sicrhau y bydd Cymru'n cael ei chynrychioli yn y prosiect hanesyddol hwn. Cipiodd Bessie Ifans Gwyn Villa yr unawd soprano a chafodd y gynulleidfa gryn hwyl yn gwrando ar Araith ar y Pryd D.B. Ifans Blaenpant. Yn ôl y disgwyl aeth yr Unawd Piano i J.J. Lewis Glanyryns. Gwelwyd yr ysgol yn orlawn unwaith eto ar y 18fed o Ionawr wrth i'r holl ardal dalu teyrnged a dymuno'n dda i'r Prifathro, Griff Morris, yn ymadael am ei swydd newydd ger Llanelli. Prin fyddai neb wedi dychmygu y byddai ef a'i deulu' nol yng nghapel Bethel o fewn dwy flynedd yn galari colli ei fab Emrys yn y Rhyfel. Pan gladdwyd Mrs Howells Pantiouar ym mynwent yr eglwys fis ar ôl hynny, dywedwyd fod yna ddeigrynn yn llygad pawb.

'Roedd Eisteddfod Fawr fis Mai yn achlysur go bwysig gyda thalentau'n cael eu denu o bell. Daeth pedair Pryddest tri chan llinell i law i ennill canmoliaeth y beirniad, a phan aeth y wobr gynta' i Bencader bu dathlu mawr ar y trêv olaf adre. Ym Mehefin, cynhaliwyd Gwasanaeth Coffa i Mrs Thomas Blaencors yn eglwys Sant Celynin, Bronwydd. Wedyn ym Mis Medi atebodd Gwilym Morris yr alwad I Gapel Ffynnonhenri yn syth o Goleg Bangor. Gwr oedd yn dilyn ôl traed ei dad, sef y Parch Thomas Morris Soar Treherbert. Tro Cynwil oedd hi eleni i gynnal Cymanfa Ganu'r Methodistiaid ym mis Hydref, ac yna daeth cylch y gwasanaethau diolchgarwch i weld holl gynnrych y fro yn addurno'r capeli ac eglwysi.

Ond heb os nac oni bai digwyddiad mwyaf cynhyrfus y flwyddyn oedd y Briodas Fawr, pan dyrrodd yr holl ardal i'w gwyllo ar y 15fed o Fehefin. Yn eglwys y Llan priododd Maggie, ail ferch Tafarn y Railwe yn ei gwisg sidan crepe a het ddu, ag Edward Stanley o Abertawe,. Gwgodd y gwragedd lleol yn eiddigeddus hefyd ar y ddwy forwyn briodas, hefyd yn eu gwisgoedd sidan a'u hetiau crand. Ei brawd John roddodd Maggie i ffwrdd, cymeriad amlwg a hoffus i'r holl ardal. Y Railwe oedd ei gartref ond adnabuwyd ef gan bawb fel John y Glo; y fe, a'i gaseg enwog Polly, fu'n dosbarthu glo drwy'r holl ardal am ddegawdau. Wedi'r gwasanaeth yn ôl a'r gwesteion i'r Railwe am y Brecwast Briodas, lle bu llawer o hwyl a sawl llwncdestun. Gyda chawodydd o reis a dymuniadau da ymadawodd y par hapus am Gaerfyrddin, na nid ar y trêv, ond yn un o'r ceir modur newydd yna. A lawr a nhw heibio i Bantycelyn ac i fyny Rhiw Cwpers. Yna mewn siwt o las twyll a het wen y tro hwn, camodd Maggie, law yn llaw a'i gwr, ar y trêv o Gaerfyrddin am Fryste i fwynhau eu mis mel. Diwrnod bythgoifiadwy, a'r peth pella' o feddwl neb oedd rhyfel!

Malcolm Howells - From Coal to Cows!

Very few individuals within the community of Llanpumsaint had any links whatsoever with the mining industry but the late Malcolm Howells, Pandy was truly a coal miner and had the scars to prove it. Malcolm Howells, born in Ponthenry and whose early years were spent in Pontyates, moved to Pandy after marrying Elvira in the July of 1958, and worked the smallholding with the family as well as being a miner in Cynheidre Colliery until his retirement in 1987, having spent 37 years in the mining industry.

Malcolm Howells possessed many skills, having been a farm worker before taking up employment with a construction company, James Rees Builder and it was from the building trade that Malcolm became a collier. Perhaps Malcolm's greatest sporting love was for the beautiful game and his love of sport was not that of today's couch potato, he played in the full back position for three local teams, Meinciau, Porthyrhyd and Llandysul. When Malcolm moved to Llanpumsaint, it was a wholehearted relocation and he soon became known as Malcolm Pandy and immersed himself in community life with great commitment and became a trustee or committee member of various organisations which included the Hall, Welfare, Short Mat Bowls Chairman and was Governor of the village school and Cambria Secondary School. A numerous gathering of family, friends, neighbours and members of many organisations gathered at Narberth Cematorium to pay their last respects to Malcolm and the family had kindly organised light refreshments for mourners at the Roadhouse Restaurant near Whitland after the funeral.

Speeding in our Village

As a resident with children and dogs I regularly walk and cycle around Llanpumsaint and I am very concerned about the number of vehicles that speed through our village. I love living here and as a pedestrian I notice the speeding traffic more as I walk to the shop, school, pub, village hall , allotments and to visit friends. Coopers Hill has a 30mph sign but also an incline which encourages cars, vans and farm vehicles to speed up as they drive through the village. There is one other small 30mph sign by the sewage works and then no other signage to remind people that they should slow down. We also have an issue with speeding past the park and I know some people have suggested speed bumps there to slow traffic down. As cars drive through Llanpumsaint the 30mph speed limit seems to be totally unsuitable in the narrow roads near to the school and I think a 20mph limit would be safer and more pleasant for those villagers living in that area.

I am worried there will be a child run over as they walk/cycle to school and this could be avoided if more care were taken and speeds were reduced to 30mph or less (especially approaching bends).

First World War Centenary Wood for Wales in Carmarthenshire

The Woodland Trust (Coed Cadw) has unveiled plans to create a First World War Centenary Wood in Wales. The land identified is a 120 acre site near the village of Carway in the undulating landscape of the Gwendraeth Valley to the North West of Llanelli, near the Ffos Las Racecourse.

This new wood is intended to be one of four to be created in each of the countries of the UK, to commemorate the Centenary of the First World War. Land of this scale very rarely becomes available and the Trust needs to raise at least half a million pounds by the end of August to be confident the project is financially viable so that it can commit to purchase, plant and care for the site and so ensure that Wales is represented in this historic project. The full cost of the project will be around £1.2m.

The Trust aims to plant 90,000 native trees at the site, creating a patchwork of woodland and meadows of wildflowers including the iconic Flanders poppy. The wood is to include a special memorial area to commemorate everyone who served in the First World War. And access and interpretation will be provided for all. Indeed, the Trust is keen to involve the local community in the planning and creation of the new Centenary Wood, offering local people and children from local schools the opportunity to plant some of the trees themselves.

Jerry Langford, Wales Director of the Woodland Trust says: “We aim to plant 90,000 native trees at the site. They will stand tall in tribute to a generation of 100 years ago, providing a lasting tribute to all those involved in the First World War. We hope to see thousands of people getting involved by planting their own tribute or dedicating trees in memory of loved ones. In addition to the 1,000 acres of woodland created at these four Centenary Woods, there will be over 150,000 free trees available to Welsh schools, community groups and youth groups for planting, and the Trust hopes that landowners and communities across the country will get involved to create hundreds of new woods containing millions of trees. Road Safety

With the good growing weather this summer, many hedges and bushes adjacent to pavements and roads and at junctions have grown over the boundary. This can mean that pedestrians have to walk further into the road, cyclists ride in the middle of roads and overgrown hedges obscure views for drivers when they come out of driveways and at junctions. Now that the birds have finished nesting, just taking a few inches off the width of a hedge and bushes makes such a difference to the safety of pedestrians, cyclists and motorists.

The other 1914

We have become conditioned to associate the year 1914 with war. Yet when one examines our own locality in that year, all thoughts of suffering and the horrors of conflict were very far away. War talk was about something remote, to do with distant Europe and if it happened, would be over and done with before Christmas anyway. Life in rural Llanpumsaint a hundred years ago ambled on, following the age old cycles of religious, farming, and cultural activities; an annual calendar repeated and celebrated year in year out. 1914 was no different.

The year kicked off with the New Year's day Eisteddfod , then held at the packed out school (no hall then). Rachel Edwards Llwyngwyn won the Under 8 Recitation, whilst Sarah Thomas Pantyffordd triumphed at Under 10. Bessie Evans Gwyn Villa captured the sopranino solo and D.B. Evans Blaenpant delighted the audience with his Impromptu Speech rendering. Amongst other winners the piano solo predictably went to J.J. Lewis Glanyryns. The school was crowded out once more on the 18th of January, when the whole community assembled to pay tribute to Griff Morris, the departing Headmaster, bound for Llanelli. Little did anyone imagine he'd be back to Bethel chapel within two years to grieve the loss of his son in the war. Mrs Howells Pantiouar was buried in February “..with hardly a dry eye in the church”. The annual May Eisteddfod was big affair and there was so much talent around in those days. In the Pryddest poetry competition, required a 300 line verse entry, all 4 compositions received drew great praise from the adjudicator. With the prize going to Pencader there'd be celebrations on the last train up! In June at Saint Celynin Bronwydd, there was a memorial service for Mrs Thomas Blaencors, and September witnessed the arrival of a new Minister at Ffynnonhenri chapel. Gwilym Morris arrived there straight from Bangor college. Then in October the cycle saw the Methodist musical Gymanfa being held in Conwil that year. There followed the usual fruit festooned thanksgiving services in all the places of worship.

Yet undoubtedly the event of the year was that wedding on the 15th of June, which the whole neighbourhood eagerly turned out to witness. Maggie, the second daughter of the Railway Hotel, wearing a dress of satin crepe with a black hat to match, got married to Mr Edward Stanley of Swansea at the crowded parish church,. The bridesmaids in bisuit silk with hats to match, also drew gasps of envy from the assembled watchers outside the church. The bride was given away by her brother John Thomas, one of Llanpumsaint's real characters. He was the local coal merchant operating from the Railway Hotel and the station yard with his legendary mare Polly ruling the deliveries. After the ceremony, a sumptuous Breakfast followed back at the Railway with numerous toasts and jollity. Amidst showers of rice and good wishes the happy couple left for Carmarthen station, not by train, but by one of those novel motor cars. A touch of class to be sure! Then attired in a navy blue costume and white hat, Maggie arm in arm with Stanley, boarded the Bristol bound train for their honeymoon. What a day! All thoughts of war were very far away!
